## MINUTES of February 25, 2009

The Zonta Club of Pierre-Fort Pierre held its monthly meeting at 12:00 p.m. on February 25, 2009, at the Pierre Masonic Temple. The Call to Order was made by President Laurie Gustafson; Del Paulson read The Collect.

**Program:** The speaker was Jo Doll, a former Zonta member, who talked about ovarian and primary peritoneal cancers. Speaking on behalf of all who have had these cancers as well as from personal experience, Jo provided us great information. Jo relayed that ovarian cancer may not be given as much publicity as other cancers in women because the symptoms are subtle and varied. Jo emphasized the need for women to be aware of changes that might be unique to you and your situation, as there are things only you know about yourself. She discussed the need to communicate with healthcare professionals and if you have questions or inklings to ask them right away - don't put it off! If at first you don't succeed, keep asking until you have satisfactory answers. It's important to find a qualified OB/GYN specialist that is also an oncologist in order to get the best care. Jo said that early detection of ovarian cancer is key and should it be diagnosed, be optimistic; being in the best health you can be will enable you to get through the discovery and treatment process and on to the important part: healing and living. The handouts Jo provided were great and ones that should be shared with friends and family.

## **Women in Science Becomes Expanding Your Horizons**

The Pierre Women in Science Conference (WIS) has joined the national Expanding Your Horizons Network (EYH). The Network is a non-profit membership organization of educators, scientists, mathematicians, parents, community leaders, and government and corporate representatives. The mission is to encourage young women to pursue science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) careers. Through Expanding Your Horizons (EYH) Network programs, members provide STEM role models and hands-on activities for middle and high school girls. The ultimate goal is to motivate girls to become innovative and creative thinkers ready to meet 21st century challenges.

As part of the network, Pierre WIS will become the *SD Discovery Center Expanding Your Horizons Conference*. As part of the national network, the conference planners will have access to resources that will help recruit speakers and increase the hands-on nature of the sessions, to an on-line registration system and to a pre-designed conference packet for the girls. The SD Discovery Center EYH conference is scheduled for April 7, 2008, from 8:30 am to 5 pm at the Ramkota. Tanya Crevier, "World's Best Female Basketball Handler," from Jefferson, South Dakota, will be the keynote speaker and entertainment. New this year, the committee has accepted proposals from those interested in presenting sessions. A group of girls will select the actual sessions from those proposals. Danette Jarzab of the SD Discovery Center is this year's conference coordinator.

As in past years the Pierre-Fort Pierre AAUW Branch will be the luncheon host. The *Expanding Your Horizons* Committee, however, is also looking for volunteer(s) from other groups to assist in many ways throughout the Conference, i.e., registration and to act as session hosts. # Women's History Month

Before 1970, women's history was rarely the subject of serious study. As historian Mary Beth Norton recalls, "only one or two scholars would have identified themselves as women's historians, and no formal doctoral training in the subject was available anywhere in the country." Since then, however, the field has undergone a metamorphosis. Today almost every college offers women's history courses and most major graduate programs offer doctoral degrees in the field.

## **The Women's Movement**

Two significant factors contributed to the emergence of women's history. The women's movement of the sixties caused women to question their invisibility in traditional American history texts. The movement also raised the aspirations as well as the opportunities of women, and produced a growing number of female historians. Carroll Smith-Rosenberg, one of the early women's historians, has remarked that "without question, our first inspiration was political. Aroused by feminist charges of economic and political discrimination, ... we turned to our history to trace the origins of women's second-class status."

## **New Social History**

Women's history was also part of a larger movement that transformed the study of history in the United States. "History" had traditionally meant political history—a chronicle of the key political events and of the leaders, primarily men, who influenced them. But by the 1970s "the new social history" began replacing the older style. Emphasis shifted to a broader spectrum of American life, including such topics as the history of urban life, public health, ethnicity, the media, and poverty.

## **The Personal Is Political**

Since women rarely held leadership positions and until recently had only a marginal influence on politics, the new history, with its emphasis on the sociological and the ordinary, was an ideal vehicle for presenting women's history. It has covered such subjects as the history of women's education, birth control, housework, marriage, sexuality, and child rearing. As the field has grown, women's historians realized that their definition of history needed to expand as well—it focused primarily on white middle-class experience and neglected the full racial and socio-economic spectrum of women.

## **Women's History Month**

The public celebration of women's history in this country began in 1978 as "Women's History Week" in Sonoma County, California. The week including March 8, International Women's Day, was selected. In 1981, Sen. Orrin Hatch (R-Utah) and Rep. Barbara Mikulski (D-Md.) co-sponsored a joint Congressional resolution proclaiming a national Women's History Week. In 1987, Congress expanded the celebration to a month, and March was declared Women's History Month.
